

- 2. Avoid yelling at referee
- 3. Lead by example

- 2. Less experienced referees to officiate games
- 3. Coach being disciplined

Do we know these terms:

Term	Definition	Example
Abuse	Extreme, deliberate, and non-contact behavior that causes a Referee or Protected Party significant harm.	"You better watch your back!" "You're a F-ing joke!" "That call was S***!"
Assault	Any deliberate physical action against a Referee	Punching, spitting on, kicking, or throwing a physical object at the official
Gross Mistreatment	Any deliberate, non-contact behavior that is expected to cause harm to a Referee, but does not meet the definitions of abuse and assault	"You're the worst referee we've ever had!" "You're terrible!" "How much is the other team paying you!"







We must change the culture of youth soccer...

- US Soccer has provided clear minimum punishments that are being enacted across the country.
- We cannot continue to allow the vocal minority of bad actors to push our officials out before they have had the chance to reach their potential
- We must find other ways to manage the emotion of the game.











PENALTY OVERVIEW

The Penalties Matrix defines consequences associated with physical and non-physical offenses against Referees.

Minor or Slight Deliberate Touching	3	1-6 Months
Pushing, Grabbing, Pulling, Squeezing, Pinching, Lightly Slapping, Use of Object in Non- Striking Manner, or Physical Property Damage	10	6-24Months
Hitting, Punching, Elbowing, Kicking, Biting, Spiting, Choking, Tackling, Throwing or Use of Object or Any Part of Body (Forearm, Knee, Head) in a Striking Manner		12 Months - Lifetime

KEY PENALTY FACTORS

- Single offenses are at minimum the prescribed game penalty or time penalty for non red zone offenses
- Penalties can be both game and time depending on severity / circumstances
- Second time offenders receive double punishment
- •Third time offenders receive a lifetime ban
- More than one offense at the same time is at least the punishment for the most serious offense
- Offenses against minors are automatically subject to a "minor multiplier" resulting in triple punishment
- •One offense warning per league to be managed by states and leagues collaboratively
- Game consequences are inclusive of 1 game penalty for any red cards given
- Optionality for 50% penalty for first offense from a minor

Please follow your current reporting structure – updated reporting procedure will be a part of Phase 3.

(*) Disclaimer: These are only a few examples of abuse —other actions or statements may also fall into this category.





How do we do things differently?

When you feel frustrated by a referee's call:

- 1) Take a moment to pause and breathe.
- 1) Reflect on how your reaction impacts your experience and the overall atmosphere of the game for everyone involved.
 - Is the game intense and physical?
 - Can you feel the temperature of the game?
 - Will your comments/reaction make the game more or less contentious?

If you have concerns about a call:

- 1) Take a moment to gather yourself
- 2) Respectfully ask the referee for clarification calmly, aiming for constructive communication rather than causing conflict
 - Are you trying to understand the call, or are you looking to argue why you think the call was wrong?

- >ALL GOALS MUST BE ANCHORED PROPERLY PRIOR TO ANY SOCCER BEING PLAYED ON ANY SOCCER FIELD.
- ➤ Home Team Responsibility
- ➤ Referees will not start the game without the Goals anchored properly



RESCHEDULING: WEATHER CANCELLATIONS

- Coaches will have 6 days from the date the game was cancelled to have the game rescheduled.
- Games will be rescheduled thru the online game change system.
- Home coach will contact the opposing coach and provide three dates for the opposing coach to choose from.
- Once an agreement is reached, the home coach will enter the reschedule online, the opposing coach will approve, and the home team competitive director will also approve.
- After the home team competitive director approves the game, the game will be updated on the Super Liga website.
- If an agreement cannot be reached by the deadline, the Super Liga will schedule the game.



IN SEASON SPECIAL GAME CHANGE REQUEST

- A special game change request can be made with at least a 4-day notice from the original game date.
- The special game change request must be emailed to Oscar DeLemos, <u>odelemos@thesuperliga.com</u>, and accompany with the reason for the change and the reschedule date and time of the game.
- Super Liga will confirm with opposing association/club competitive director and upon confirmation will then update the game on the website.
- There will be a fee of \$50 for every game change approved.



CLUB PASS POLICY

Divisions

- 1. Anchor/Open
- 2. Classic
- 3. Classic Gold ***
- 4. Classic Blue ***
- 5. Rhody

*** Age groups will have either a single division Classic OR separate divisions Classic Gold, Classic Blue

All Age Groups

- 1. Players can move up or laterally in a division or age group.
- 2. Players cannot move down divisions in any circumstances.
- 3. Players who play up in a higher age group can only move to an equal/higher division in their qualified age group.



CLUB PASS POLICY

Substitutes

Age Groups 7U-12U can Club Pass to a maximum of four (4) substitutes Age Groups 13U-19U can Club Pass to a maximum of six (6) substitutes

Dual Rostered Players

The highest ranked division is used for applying the Club Pass Policy

Administrative

- 1. All players must be rostered to at least one team
- 2. Club Pass players' names are manually written on the game day roster
- 3. Club Pass players cannot be used for playoffs and championships
- 4. Girls can play on boys teams
- 5. Boys cannot play on girls teams

Penalty

Violations of the policy results in a game forfeit, fine, and coach's one (1) game suspension



PLAYER DUAL ROSTER POLICY

Any Super Liga player can be dual rostered within their association/club for Super Liga play.

- A player rostered to an Anchor or Open team, cannot be dual rostered on a Rhody team.
- No 7U-14U team can have more the 40% of their roster with dual rostered players.
- No 16U-19U team can have more the 50% of their roster with dual rostered players.
 - Ex. 16 total players on a 14U roster, 40% = 6.4 > Rounded down to - 6 players.
 - Ex. 14 total players on a 12U roster, 40% = 5.6 > Rounded up to - 6 players.
- Dual rostered players must play 4 games for both teams that they are rostered to. Violation of this part of the policy will result in the player being disqualified for the playoffs.



GOAL DIFFERENTIAL POLICY

THE JUPER LIGA will not record a final score of more than a 4-goal differential for any game, expect in the 7U-8U age groups.

Goal differential policy does not apply to 7U-8U age groups.

If a team's winning score of a Super Liga game is a nine-goal differential:

- First Offense- A warning.
- Second Offense, a point deduction from the standings.

If a team 's winning score of a Super Liga game is a ten-goal differential or more:

• The coach will be suspended for the following two Super Liga games and a point deducted for the standings.

If both coaches agree by the start of the game, they can opt out of the Goal


Differential Policy. The referee must be notified, and a note must be
made in the game report.

NOTE: If an unordinary situation occurs Super Liga will have discretion.



PLAYERS & COACHES PASSES

- Every Player and Coach <u>must</u> have a current USYS Pass.
- The passes can be a physical laminated pass or a virtual pass on any mobile device.

NOTE: MAX 3 Coaches allowed in the players'/coaches' box







USSF HEADING POLICY

Based on the United States Soccer Federation's recommendation, the **JUPER LIGA** has implemented the following policy.....

- ✓ All players 10 years old and younger, shall not engage in heading in practice/training or in games.
- √ 7U,8U,9U,10,11U Age Groups



USSF HEADING POLICY



When a player deliberately heads the ball in a game....

An indirect free kick (IFK) will be awarded to the opposing team from the spot of the offense

If a player does not deliberately head the ball, then play should continue.

If the deliberate header occurs within the goal area, the indirect free kick will be taken on the goal area line parallel to the goal line at the point nearest to where the infringement occurred



JUPER LIGA HEAD TRAUMA POLICY

Referee stops game due to player(s) head trauma Player must be removed from the game and not allowed to return

Referee must indicate incident on game report


- Player cannot return to any soccer player until Super Liga receives medical clearance from the player's health care provider.
- Medical Clearance Notes need to be emailed to director@thesuperliga.com
- Upon receipt of the notes, Super Liga communicate with the coordinator and coach, that the player will be allowed to resume soccer activity.


LIGHTNING POLICY

- Coaches and Referees need to communicate with each other prior to start of game- if there are thunderstorms in the forecast during the game.
- If lightning is observed by any referee or coaches, the referee will stop the game immediately.
- Referee must wait 20 Minutes between observing lightning before the game can resume.
- ➤ Maximum 40-minute delay before terminating game
- •Game terminated in the 1st half
 - Referee crew keeps half the game fee
 - Game is replayed
- Game terminated at half-time and beyond
 - Referee crew keeps game fee.
 - Score is final at the time of termination



LAW 5 - THE REFEREE

One Referee per game: Referee Fee = \$24 (\$12/team)

LAW 6 – ASSISTANT REFEREE

None required

LAW 7 - DURATION OF THE MATCH

4 Quarters – 12 minutes each

LAW 8 - THE START AND RESTART OF PLAY

Restart after a goal: From the center circle.

LAW 10 - THE METHOD OF SCORING

Conform to FIFA rules



7U-8U 4 V 4 FORMAT

LAW 11 - OFFSIDES

There will be no offsides.

LAW 12 - FOULS & MISCONDUCTS

- Conform with FIFA with the following modifications...
- All fouls will be INDIRECT FREE KICKS with the opponent 5 yards away.
- Fouls inside the goal box will result in ball being placed 5 yards outside the goal box (this allows opponent to establish a wall).
- The referee shall explain all infractions to the offending players.


LAW 13 - FREE KICKS

 All FREE KICKS will be INDIRECT with the opponent 5 yards away from the ball.

LAW 16 - GOAL KICK

- All FREE KICKS will be INDIRECT
- opponent must retrieve to midfield and not cross over until ball is put into play.



BUILD OUT LINES

The build out line promotes playing the ball out of the back in a less pressured setting.

- When the goalkeeper has the ball in his or her hands during play from the opponent, the opposing team must move behind the build out line until the ball is put into play.
- Once the opposing team is behind the build out line, the goalkeeper can pass, throw or roll the ball into play. (punts and drop kicks are not allowed).



BUILD OUT LINES

- After the ball is put into play by the goalkeeper, the opposing team can cross the build out line and play resumes as normal.
- The opposing team must also move behind the build out line during a goal kick until the ball is put into play.
- A goalkeeper cannot punt or drop kick the ball. If they do, an indirect free kick will be awarded to the opposing team from the spot of the offense.
- If the punt or drop kick occurs within the goal area, the indirect free kick should be taken on the goal area line parallel to the goal line at the nearest point to where the infringement occurred.



BUILD OUT LINES

- The build out line will also be used to denote where offside offenses can be called. Players cannot be penalized for an offside offense between the halfway line and the build out line. Players can be penalized for an offside offense between the build out line and the goal line.
- Ideally, the goalkeeper will wait to put the ball into play once all opponents are past the build out line. However, the goalkeeper can put the ball into play sooner.
